CERVINO SKI PARADISE, KEEPS REINVENTING ITSELF



From this season visitors to the Cervino Ski Paradise will be greeted by an exciting new attraction. A brand new six-seater chairlift has been installed in the Goillet area, replacing the now-outdated system previously in operation. The long-planned project is now a reality and marks another significant milestone for the resort, which is adept at constantly reinventing itself, committed as always to enhancing its facilities and providing ever-improving services for its aficionados.

Completed just in time for the start of the new winter season, the infrastructure will provide a fast link between the ski area of Breuil-Cervinia and Valtournenche, which are connected ski-in/ski-out just like neighbouring Zermatt. The chairlift is fitted with automatic coupling and the revolutionary EcoDrive system, making it both efficient and sustainable.

The EcoDrive automatically adjusts the speed of the chairlift depending on the number of skiers in line. Just one metre per second of speed reduction can generate energy savings of up to 20 per cent. In addition, thanks to DirectDrive, noise and lubricant reduction, improved efficiency and increased safety are guaranteed.

The chairlifts, 69 in total, will in their turn provide comfortable ascents at altitude: heated backrests, individual footrests for each skier, and transparent canopies for colder days. To these elements add in the reduction in travel time, as the new Goillet chairlift will take only 5 minutes (it used to be 11) to cover the almost 1,500 metres of 'inclined length'. The valley station is located at an altitude of 2,692 metres to arrive at 3,093 metres, and the hourly capacity increases from 1,600 to 2,400 passengers.



ENDLESS SKIING AT HIGH ALTITUDE 26 OCTOBER 2024 TO 7 SEPTEMBER 2025

Breuil-Cervinia, with its slopes that start at 2,000 metres and rise up to the Plateau Rosa glacier, is once again inaugurating winter well in advance. The 2024/2025 season will start on Saturday, 26 October and continue uninterrupted until Sunday, 7 September 2025. After last year's experiment, Cervino Ski Paradise confirms the "never-ending season", with no closures between spring and summer. Eleven months per annum of skiing for fans, interspersed only by a very brief closure between September and October for essential lift maintenance.





CERVINO SKI PARADISE, MID SEASONS ARE A THING OF THE PAST



Winter (and its respective ticketing rates) will come to an imaginary end on 4 May 2025, to be taken up the following day with summer fares.



Skiing in Valle d'Aosta and the Cervino Ski Paradise area is now more affordable for young skiers. A regional agreement has been signed with the aim of encouraging sporting activities, particularly skiing and snowboarding. The Junior rate with its 30% discount is now applicable to the under-16s, while the Young rate covers young people up to the age of 24, who benefit from a 20% discount. A great novelty for the Aosta Valley ski resorts, including the smallest ones, such as Torgnon and Chamois, included in the Cervino Ski Paradise. The discount is valid on the entire price list, from daily to multi-day ski passes.

MATTERHORN ALPINE CROSSING

The 3S Matterhorn Alpine Crossing cable car celebrated its first anniversary in July. This connects Testa Grigia (border area) with the Little Matterhorn and in effect links Breuil-Cervinia and Zermatt, the two resorts separated only by the incomparable Matterhorn, even more closely. The Matterhorn Alpine Crossing is a long-awaited lift system that allows people to experience the mountains to the full, including those who have never put a pair of skis on or ridden a snowboard.

Since last summer, the '3S' cable car has allowed pedestrians to move easily from one resort to another, providing a true high-altitude experience. A new tourist frontier, an innovative project that has taken years of work and that changes the landscape of the Cervino Ski Paradise ski area, which is always evolving.





In fact, the project that will lead to the construction of the new facility connecting Breuil-Cervinia to Plateau Rosa via an intermediate station at Plan Maison is already underway. The new route will provide an alternative to the current Breuil-Cervinia - Plan Maison - Cime Bianche Laghi - Plateau Rosa cableway, thus guaranteeing a permanent connection and easier maintenance scheduling.




The treadmill at Cretaz, equipped with a tunnel to protect little ones from inclement weather and renovated at the beginning of last winter, provides free fun for ski beginners. Young and old alike can ski uninterruptedly on all the ski lifts in the resort without having to buy a ski pass, a decision taken by the ski lift company to make it as easy as possible for children to start skiing.

HIGH ALTITUDE SNOWXPERIENCE

With the opening of the Alpine Crossing between Testa Grigia and the Little Matterhorn, a world of adventure immersed in snow and ice opens up on the border between Italy and Switzerland. The SnowXperience Plateau Rosa will offer exciting activities around the valley station of the new 3S Matterhorn Glacier Ride II cable car. Snow tubing and a beginner's area, space for everyone, even those who need to rent equipment on site.

From here, it takes only four minutes to reach Europe's highest station, via the new cable car, which is considered a veritable attraction: its approximately 1,600-metre length is built without pylons and guests can admire the imposing Teodulo glacier from above.







EXPERIENCING THE MOUNTAIN WITHOUT BORDERS





Breuil-Cervinia, Valtournenche and Zermatt (Switzerland), the three queens of one of the world's largest and most popular ski resorts, are linked by a myriad of pistes and a dense network of lifts that allow you to go from one resort to the other without ever having to take off your skis. Between Breuil-Cervinia and Valtournenche there are 67 pistes for a total of 157 kilometres, all skiable. With the Matterhorn to admire in all its multifaceted majesty, it is easy to plan a delicious stop to enjoy the multiple delicacies you will find in the wealth of restaurants at altitude and in the villages.

The geography of the place tells of three valleys and two countries, Italy and Switzerland, for international skiing without borders. In addition to its three pearls, Cervino Ski Paradise also includes two iconic places in the middle of the valley: Chamois, a stupendous village that can only be reached by cable car, and Torgnon, a village that is known as 'pays du soleil' (Sun village). Both resorts represent that part of the area given over to peace and quiet and family holidays, where skiing is a means of living in close contact with nature.

Being at the centre of the world of winter sports means offering tourists who come here a mix of uniqueness, starting with slopes for all levels and moving on to the panoramas that tell not only of the beauty of the Matterhorn, but of all the mountains around it, such as the splendid, pointed Grandes Murailles.

Guests can enjoy a multitude of mountain sports, a rich offering that, in addition to downhill skiing and snowboarding, also includes freeriding or heliskiing, cross-country skiing, ski mountaineering and snowshoeing.

Cervino Ski Paradise is more than just snow. Alpine villages that are still intact, active agriculture, unspoilt nature: a ski area that can be appreciated for the quality of its services and the genuineness of its inhabitants.







The two locations owe much of their fame to the fact that they lie in the shadow of the Matterhorn, the most photographed mountain in the world with its iconic silhouette, a natural pyramid of rock and snow climbing into the sky.

THE FAMOUS BREUIL-CERVINIA

Of the five resorts that make up the 'Cervino Ski Paradise', **Breuil-Cervinia** is certainly the most iconic, not only in terms of skiing, but also for its après-ski offering. Born touristically between the two wars, Breuil-Cervinia offers a holiday in an international and cosmopolitan environment, where the privacy of its guests is an imperative. Hotels with all comforts, often including state-of-theart spas and wellness centres, gourmet restaurants and places where one can taste the numerous typical products of the Aosta Valley, in characteristic, cosy settings.

The main street running through the town of Cervinia, Via Jean Antoine Carrel, is dedicated to the first alpine guide to reach the summit of the Matterhorn, and is a shopper's delight. The entire village is laid out around it and it is easy to reach the ski lifts on foot.

THE NEIGHBOURING VALTOURNENCHE

Valtournenche (a little more than 10 kilometres from Breuil-Cervinia, on the way down the valley) is a resort where the charm of the typical rascards (wooden houses) induces immediate peace of mind. The hotels offer attentive, family-friendly hospitality, making guests immediately feel at home. The best après-ski in Valtournenche is to discover the numerous villages, from Cretaz to Perrères or Crépin, where time seems to stand still. The Piazzetta delle guide alpine, in front of the church and next to the town hall, a symbol of heroic mountaineering in the 19th and 20th centuries, decorated with plaques in honour of the great Matterhorn guides, is definitely worth a visit. A warm, friendly atmosphere greets lovers of reading and music. In the library of Villa Marazzi, in Cretaz, a wide choice of books includes an extraordinary selection dedicated to the mountains.

The Breuil-Cervinia and Valtournenche area has **90 guest facilities**, mostly family-run, with a total of around **5,300 beds**. In addition to the classic hotels and residences, there are several B&Bs and rooms to let, as well as villas and holiday flats, so that the offer is complete. Many establishments offer in-house catering for dinner, but both towns offer **a wide range of restaurants**, with cuisines ranging from typical to ethnic and Scandinavian, to meet the palates of the international clientele, which accounts for around 90% of guests in winter. The **mountain huts** also offer high quality menus, and traditional wines and cheeses are available.

SUNNY TORGNON

Torgnon is nicknamed 'Le pays du soleil' (Sun village) due to its widely envied geographical location. A quiet, friendly place, it is ideal for those seeking relaxation, sport and wellness in the mountains. Overlooking the Matterhorn valley, it offers a unique view of one of the most impressive peaks inthe Alpine arc.

Nestling on the right-hand side of the valley, Torgnon is sunny for a good part of the day; downhill slopes of varying difficulty, cross-country skiing trails among the most scenic in the Aosta Valley, trekking routes for hikers of all types, spaces and activities dedicated to children, are just some of the many reasons to choose Torgnon as a holiday destination.

The resort, which is also well known for its international summer riding competitions, is just over half an hour's drive from Breuil-Cervinia and is part of the Cervino Ski Paradise area. Skiers can enjoy 25 kilometres of downhill slopes, served by three chairlifts, as many treadmills and a cable car that starts out from the village and ends in the middle of nature. In the Chantorné area, at an altitude of 1,900 metres, there is a snow park, much loved by children, especially for the very long snowtubing facility.

There is a varied range of sports on offer; guests also have at their disposal 30 kilometres of cross-country skiing tracks, 10 tracks dedicated to snowshoeing and another 20 easily accessible tracks in the environs. There are also several itineraries dedicated to ski mountaineering that start from the hamlet of Etirol (1,600 m a.s.l.) and lead to panoramic views of over 3,000 metres, such as Dôme de Tsan and Cima Bianca.

Torgnon has also always stood out for the special welcome it reserves for younger guests. In winter as in summer, there are many activities dedicated to them; the large park in the Chantorné basin does not go unnoticed, just a few metres from the arrival of the cableway, a paradise of games and attractions to entertain the youngest. The baby area includes inflatable slides, trampolines, carousels, climbing structures and various other equipment with slides and swings.

THE UNCONTAMINATED CHAMOIS

Chamois is an Alpine village sunk in a landscape of unspoilt nature where cars are unknown. It can only be reached on foot or via the Buisson-Chamois regional cable car, which is operative every day of the year. It is located in Valtournenche, at an altitude of 1,800 metres, and is part of the prestigious Alpine Pearls circuit, the network of Alpine resorts united by the common denominator of sustainability and soft mobility. Chamois is the highest municipality in the Aosta Valley and is a true oasis of peace and relaxation, capable of maintaining its traditions over time, which can be found in the rural architecture with the presence of rascards (typical wooden buildings), and in the friendliness and simplicity of its inhabitants.

A resort to be experienced and discovered even in winter, for a holiday dedicated to sporting activities and the 'slow life'. With 18 kilometres of pistes of varying difficulty exposed to the sun, it is ideal for skiing, snowboarding, freeriding, ski mountaineering and snowshoeing. At Lake Lod, a treadmill welcomes children and beginners.

The highest point that can be reached by ski lift is 'Le Point Sublime', at an altitude of 2,470 metres, where you have a privileged view of the Matterhorn.

Chamois also falls within the definition of a smaller ski resort and is thus part of the project of the Aosta Valley Region, which has decided to provide skiers with a ski pass valid for five days of skiing, plus one hour of lessons with an instructor, at a cost of 100 euros.

THE FAMOUS SLOPES OF THE CERVINO SKI PARADISE

The "**Ventina**" slope owes its fame to the incomparable view it offers of the

entire Breuil basin, as well as for a variety of viewpoints of the Matterhorn. It starts at the 3,500 metres of the Plateau Rosa glacier and arrives at the 2,050 metres of Breuil-Cervinia, a descent totalling 11 kilometres. For years, the famous Azzurrissimo (alpine ski race), an event in which the biggest names in skiing and enthusiasts of every kind challenge; one another at the end of the winter season, took place on its winding course. One of the most famous lifts in the Alps, the cable car to the top of Ventina, from the Cime Bianche Laghi station to Plateau Rosa, is an unmissable attraction, even for non-skiers.

It is called the "**Reine Blanche**" (White Queen) and is the longest slope in the resort, 22 kilometres downhill starting from the Little Matterhorn (3,883 metres in Switzerland) to Valtournenche (1,524 metres) for a total altitude difference of over 2,000 metres.

Finally, the "Black Slopes of the Matterhorn" are a must for experienced skiers, providing a privileged view of the south face of the Gran Becca. The 'Gran Roc' (number '62') ends its steep descent in the Cretaz basin; 'Vallone 5' is the name of another 'black' slope in the Breuil-Cervinia area and enjoys a special geographical location. It is often used by local skiers for training. These slopes are ideal even on very cold days because they are carved out 'inside' a natural basin. The 'Cretaz' and 'Pancheron' chairlifts, which serve these slopes, ensure a 360 degree view of the overhanging south face of the Matterhorn during the ascent.

Finally, the Cervinia Snowpark, located on slope 27. Rails, kickers and music (lots of it) make this park the ideal place for snowboard and freestyle enthusiasts of all levels. It is open every day of the season.





STELLAR SPECTACLE AND WORLD SHOWCASE THE MAGIC OF MAJOR EVENTS



SNOWBOARD CROSS WORLD CUP JUMPS AND STUNTS, FUN GUARANTEED

The slopes of Breuil-Cervinia do not only host year-round skiing; the resort has for years also been the location for the Snowboard Cross World Cup, a now traditional event that takes place just before Christmas. The circuit will land in Valtournenche in the week between 10 and 15 December 2024.

This year, the FIS (International Ski & Snowboard Federation) has chosen the Aosta Valley as the venue for opening the World Cup circuit. The focus of the boarder cross world will therefore be on 'slope 26', when the first points of the 2024/2025 season are awarded on Saturday 14 December.

Over the years, Breuil-Cervinia has offered technicians, athletes, and fans a technical, varied, and spectacular piste, the recipient of repeated acclaim thanks also to the professionalism and competence of the We Snowboard Cervinia shapers, who were also called upon to design the Beijing 2022 Olympic slopes, as well as a number of other pistes on the world circuit.

Heats consisting of four boarders each offer contests where the outcome is always uncertain and highlight the qualities of the approximately 130 athletes of 15 nationalities who come to the Aosta Valley to try and get the better of the slope that is just a stone's throw from the Matterhorn. Jumps, banked turns and false flats, an ever-evolving course that the athletes will have the opportunity to try out in the days leading up to qualifying and the race itself.

The great champions of snowboard cross can be admired from the edge of the piste, as well as in the centre of town during the race bib award ceremony on Friday evening. A moment for coming together, with autographs and selfies for everyone, young and old.

Valtournenche therefore continues to believe in the Snowboard Cross World Cup, because it is a real springboard for the winter season, which opens very early on slopes starting at an altitude of 2,000 metres.





MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES BESIDES SKIING



SNOWSHOEING AND SKI TOURING ON DEDICATED TRAILS

Several tracks in Breuil-Cervinia and Valtournenche are reserved for snowshoe and ski mountaineering enthusiasts; some of the tracks are beaten and marked in green on the maps, others are considered off-piste. For off-piste or off-piste ski mountaineering trips, the advice is to rely on the experience and professionalism of the Cervino mountain guides.

THE HIGHEST MUSEUM IN EUROPE

Located at the 3,500 metres of Plateau Rosa (reachable without skis) in the arrival area of the old cable car, 'Una Montagna di Lavoro' (A Mountain of Work) is an exhibition-museum that tells the story of the Breuil lifts, using audiovisuals and period photos: tools and artefacts of yesteryear are also on display. Admission is included in the ski pass or in the return ticket Breuil-Cervinia - Plateau Rosa. On the museum terrace, a wind rose makes it easy to identify all the peaks in the area.



AREAS FOR CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Thanks to its high altitude (2,050 metres), the Breuil-Cervinia slope is open all winter with natural snowfall. Its location on the edge of the village makes it easy to get to. It consists of a 3-kilometre-long loop with a varied course that is suitable for beginners and experts alike.

By contrast, the slope in the village of Champlève in Valtournenche (1,841 metres) is more secluded and daunting. It consists of a beginner's loop about 1 kilometre long, a second one of medium difficulty of 2.5 kilometres and yet another one with a medium-difficult ascent of 3.8 kilometres. The scenery here is truly unique.





MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES BESIDES SKIING



CHILLING OUT AND FITNESS IN VALTOURNENCHE

The Valtournenche municipal swimming pool is located in the sports centre in Piazza Carrel. Inside you will find a 25-metre pool with 5 lanes; it has a depth ranging from 120 to 180 centimetres and is suitable for swimmers. The pool enjoys an incomparable view of the woods and there are instructors on the premises for lessons if required. There is also a sauna and Turkish bath, more suitable for those who wish to rest after the exertions of skiing, as well as a weights room and gym with volleyball, basketball and five-a-side football.

THE MAISON DE L'ALPAGE MUSEUM

This museum located in the centre of Valtournenche, in a historic rascard, aims to recall the importance of agriculture for tourism. The permanent exhibition at the Maison de l'Alpage provides an overview of alpine pastoral life. Visitors can participate in guided tours and, during the summer, in educational workshops and trips round the area.



HELISKIING AWAY FROM THE SLOPES

The area offers the possibility of off-piste skiing with helicopter lift-off. From mid-December to mid-May, the Four-Thousanders are within flying distance, when conditions are deemed suitable by the mountain guides. Great altitudes and altitude differences as well as descents around the Matterhorn and Monte Rosa, strictly accompanied by a professional

ICE RINK

Open throughout the winter season, the ice rink is floodlit and, if you book first, you can play curling. The ice is natural and the manager, Lino, takes care of maintenance. Skating here means enjoying the view of the Matterhorn. The facility is open until midnight and skates can be hired.





MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES BESIDES SKIING



IN THE AIR WITH A PARAGLIDER

Fly, skis at your feet, over the slopes. Tandem paragliding is one of the attractions of Breuil-Cervinia for those looking to spike their holiday with a little extra adrenaline. An expert instructor accompanies you on your flight which takes off from Plan Maison, from the arrival area of the Pancheron chairlift, or from Plateau Rosa.

SNOWMOBILE RIDES

On a circuit adjacent to the Blue Lake area, easily reachable in 10 minutes on foot from Breuil-Cervinia, it is possible to get behind the wheel of snowmobiles to experience the thrill of speeding down a track, or go for simple excursions. The meeting point is adjacent to the old bobsleigh track, a relic of the resort's past.



SLEDDOG RIDES

The husky experience is available throughout the winter, from Wednesday to Sunday. The real stars are the huskies, four-legged friends who will accompany you in silence in the midst of nature. Sleddogging is an experience that must be tried at least once and will enchant even the youngest guests. The outing lasts about an hour and is open to youngsters of all ages.





A GLIMPSE OF NEXT SUMMER

From its 4,478 metres, the Matterhorn watches over the whole of Valtournenche, which in summer is recognisable in the colours of green and white, with Plateau Rosa the undisputed realm of summer skiing. Fast, modern ski-lifts mean that you can comfortably reach magical places, walk at high altitudes, cycle on the many mountain bike trails, ski as if it were winter, or taste the flavours of tradition at the restaurants scattered along the trails that, like some natural mosaic, design itineraries for all, from the neophyte to the experienced mountaineer



SKIING (ALMOST) ALL YEAR ROUND

Skiing in Breuil-Cervinia never stops, and even when temperatures rise, it is possible to continue skiing on the Plateau Rosa glacier, which can be reached by cable car in just over half an hour from the village. The high altitudes over which the entire ski area is spread, from the 3,500 metres of Plateau Rosa to the 3,899 metres of the Rollin Hump, are the best guarantee of the quality of the snow. For snowboard and freestyle fans, there is the 'Snowpark Zermatt'. The 'Ice Cave' (Little Matterhorn), with its fantastic sculptures, is a unique attraction. Since last July, it has been conveniently accessible with the new 3S Matterhorn Alpine Crossing cable car.



MOUNTAIN BIKING

As mountain bikes can be taken on to lifts, many enthusiasts frequent the 'Cervino Bike Park', which offers a mix of downhill (about 23 kilometres for 2,000 metres of altitude difference) and cross country (about 40 kilometres for 1,300 metres of altitude difference). Here is the only track in the world dedicated to 'fat wheels', which starts from a glacier (Plateau Rosa) and arrives in Cervinia village, along the route of the legendary "Maxiavalanche" bikers' race, which has become a fixed appointment for all the funambulists of the discipline. A special e-bike route created around the Cime Bianche lake has been available for several seasons now. Bicycles (also with assisted pedalling) can be rented on site.





A GLIMPSE OF NEXT SUMMER





ALPINISM

The most photographed mountain on the planet attracts climbers from all over the world and can be climbed in the company of a mountain guide, a truly unique experience. However, the Matterhorn guides also organise less demanding outings, such as to the Breithorn, the Four-Thousander par excellence for your high-altitude "baptism", or simply spending an afternoon on the vie ferrate to learn the rudiments of the art. There are also plenty of rock faces on which to try your hand at never getting bored.

TREKKING AND NATURE TRAILS

The most interesting high-altitude treks for sportspeople are the 'Tour of the Matterhorn' and the 'Grand Balcony of the Matterhorn', which are spectacular in terms of their views and of their challenging length. The many nature trails, suitable for everyone, are scattered along the entire Valtournenche and allow you to admire the great peaks up close, walking in total relaxation, immersed in unspoilt nature. Ideal for families is the 'Jean-Antoine Carrel Path', dedicated to the first man to reach the summit of the Matterhorn from the Italian route on 17 July 1865. A 30-kilometre hike (which can also be walked in parts) that starts and finishes in the hamlet of Perrères (Valtournenche) and reaches, at its highest point, the l'Oriondé refuge (2,802 metres), at the foot of the Matterhorn. A sheer pleasure to walk with the whole family and in company, the 'Sentiero Sant'Anna' (St. Anna's Path) runs through the pastures of the 'Tramal Dameun' (2,390 metres) of the Alpe Promindoz and leads to a little chapel in crystal and metal built in 1994 in the presence of the Grandes Murailles and the Matterhorn, which was chosen by Pope John Paul II on 19 July 2000 for a day of rest and meditation. Not to be forgotten is the 'Abbé Gorret Trail', easy and suitable for all, featuring a priceless view from Monte Motta (Valtournenche) towards Les Grandes Murailles.





A GLIMPSE OF NEXT SUMMER



CERVINO GOLF CLUB

At the foot of the Matterhorn, surrounded by a panorama that is unique for beauty and exposure, one summer attraction is the Cervino Golf Club, the highest 18-hole course in Italy. Over the years it has hosted several tournaments of the European Alps professional circuit. The course, a par 69 of 5,300 metres, runs alongside the River Marmore, starting from the centre of Breuil-Cervinia. The driving range has 15 tees, some of which are covered, and there are also putting greens and bunkers. During the season, which runs from the beginning of June to the beginning of September, weekly golf clinics are organised, where golfers of all levels and ages can improve their technique with lessons from the best professionals.




FUN FOR THE LITTLE ONES

Children's games are scattered throughout Valtournenche's hamlets, making it easy for the smaller guests to enjoy a fun break. In Breuil-Cervinia, the main one is located in the central area of Cretaz and is characterised by a fantastic castle complete with Matterhorn flags, with an adjacent 'Kid Zone' (for a fee) offering games, slides, bouncy castles and forts. For older children, sunbeds can be rented.

In Valtournenche, at the arrival of the Valtournenche-Salette chairlift, there is a park equipped with a 124-metre snowtubing slope, for descents with inflatable doughnuts and a fun family challenge. There are also various types of games, as well as two lift carpets.



MULTIMEDIA AREA
